

The Musician Sessions grew out of a need during the COVID pandemic to find a way to let the musicians communicate to us, the audience, and to have the opportunity of playing music that perhaps stretches them. We like to keep performing. It's what turns our cranks as musicians.

A year ago, we used the Winter Chamber Series as a pilot to explore how we would continue to operate under these pandemic conditions. DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Bach to Banfield is a 40-minute performance that features both contemporary and traditional classical chamber works, curated and performed by the musicians of the WCO in collaboration with Music Director Andrew Sewell.

Our first concert, *Bach to Banfield*, takes the audience on a journey from the Baroque period to the present day. The series opens with the third of Bach's six famous *Brandenburg Concerti Grossi* from 1722. Nineteenth century French composer Louise Farrenc's Quintet is steeped in the Romantic style, with beautiful melodies and long phrases. In between is a unique combination of four instruments, a quartet by early 20th century composer, Bohuslav Martinů, for clarinet, horn, cello, and snare drum.

Works from the early twenty-first century are woven into tonight's performance. Our Composer in Residence Dr. Bill Banfield's woodwind quintet, entitled *Dance Like the Wind* from Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf, was commissioned by Duke University over 20 years ago in 2000 as a live score to accompany the movie, *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf*. This jazz-infused selection is extracted from a score totaling over an hour in length.

Many Faces, a commissioned work for double tenor steel pans by steel pan icon, Cliff Alexis, was written specifically for WCO's principal percussionist Lana Wordel in 1988. Alexis, Lana's college professor and mentor at Northern Illinois University, composed the piece for her final recital and custom-built Lana's steel pans, still used by her today. Alexis (1937–2019) spent his life performing, teaching, composing, arranging, building, and tuning steel pans for musicians around the world.





DR. BILL BANFIELD

Banfield is an award-winning composer whose symphonies, operas, and chamber

works have been performed and recorded by major symphonies across the country. He is one of the most performed, recorded composers of his generation. Banfield's work to date includes twelve symphonies, seven operas, nine concerti, chamber, as well as jazz and popular forms.

We are delighted to perform Bill's work for woodwind quintet, *Dance Like the Wind*, in this weekend's Musician Sessions concert, Bach to Banfield. Please join us on January 28, 2022, for the world premiere of Banfield's Symphony No. 8, *Here I Stand*, inspired by Paul Robeson.


